- 1. **WELCOME/CALL TO ORDER (B. Bray)** Convener gavels the meeting to order and declares a quorum. Convener acknowledges significance of organization's the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Convener presents an outline of the business meeting: declaration of a quorum, officer reports, and voting.
- 2. **SECRETARY'S REPORT (B. Bray, T. Smith, and M. Guerin fill in for G. Nichol on excused absence)** The minutes of the 2013 CWEMF Annual Meeting were reviewed by all present, and passed unanimously.
- 3. **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT** (**E. Archibald**) Executive Director (ED) welcomed attendees to the meeting and began with a recap of 2013-2014 accomplishments starting with a highlight of several workshops; C2VSim, ICF, and IWFM in collaboration with DWR and also Economic Modeling of Agricultural Water Use and Production in collaboration with UC Davis Center for Watershed Sciences. ED continued highlighting accomplishments noting the completion of peer review project of Integrated Groundwater/Surface Water Models which included workshop on the draft report and completion/publishing of the document on the website <a href="http://www.cwemf.org/Pubs/">http://www.cwemf.org/Pubs/</a>, ED acknowledged the support of USBR in providing grant funding to conduct the peer review.

ED next highlighted activities of the past year including planning for the 2014 Annual Meeting and participation in planning for the Joint Session with IEP on Wednesday February 26, 2014. ED also noted that the student mentor lunch is a new activity at the Annual Meeting. ED stated that collaboration with the Delta Science Program was a major activity in 2013-2014. This included participating in joint planning sessions with IEP and the Delta Science Program for an evening social and brainstorming session on Wednesday night at Annual Meeting and planning for the Delta Modeling Summit Workshop. ED also highlighted continued progress by the Steering Committee on the strategic plan as well as completion of updates to the by-laws.

ED report shifted to a discussion of plans for the upcoming year, 2014-2015 touching on plans for several workshops taking shape including additional IWFM/C2VSIM workshops with DWR and the Modeling Summit with DSP. ED noted a possible peer review of CVP/IRP efforts that is under consideration as well.

Other major activities in 2014 – 2015 include planning for the 2015 Annual Meeting, planning efforts with the Delta Science Program, development of the Strategic Plan and Bylaws documents, updating the website, increasing student involvement, and participating in planning for discussions around the benchmarking study concept that will be explored at the evening social.

ED concluded her report with a request that members thank our sponsors and listing them as follows:

4. TREASURER'S REPORT (S. Tanaka) – Treasurer began with a report on Fiscal Year 2012 (July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013). Treasurer highlighted income categories: annual meeting and workshop registration fees, donations and memberships and major expense categories: compensation and annual meeting and workshop fees. Treasurer discussed how income, expenses, and net revenue for FY12 compare with the prior three fiscal years using the Table below.

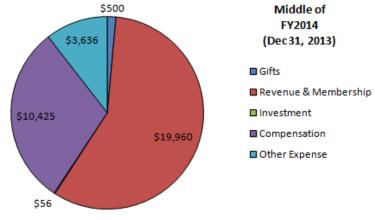
Treasurer also noted that the Operating Reserve fund is \$35,000.

Treasurer continued her report with a status report for Mid-Fiscal Year 2013 (July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014).

- Income is \$20,517
- Expenses are \$22,024
- Net Revenue is \$(1,507)

Treasurer stated that for the remainder of FY13, expenses are anticipated for executive director compensation and annual meeting costs.

Income is also anticipated from meeting registration, and membership dues.



5. VICE CONVENER REPORT ON TECHNICAL WORKSHOPS (J. Medellin-Azura) – Vice Convener (VC) opened with a discussion of several workshops being planned for 2014. The first one highlighted is another training workshop in collaboration with DWR on the California Central Valley Groundwater-Surface Water Simulation Model (C2VSim) to be held in Fresno this Spring 2014. CSU Fresno and UC Merced are helping with planning logistics for this workshop. The second workshop VC discussed is planning underway for an Integrated Regional Water Management and Planning: Essential Ingredients for a Successful Recipe workshop for May or June 2014. Planning is being led by Infram and CWEMF in collaboration with DWR. The third workshop in the planning phase is a hands on training with PEST, an automatic calibration routine for generic models. This third workshop is also being planned in collaboration with DWR and others in Sacramento for April 2014. VC's presentation then transitioned to acknowledge CWEMF partners in the workshops conducted this past year including Department of Water Resources, Bay Delta Office and especially their staff members Charlie Brush, Tariq Kadir, and Can Dogrul, also West Yost and Associates and their staff members Pery Siepman and Ken Loy, as well as the UC Davis Center for Watershed Sciences.

6. **VOTING: BYLAWS UPDATE (B. Bray)** – Convener opened this discussion explaining the need for the vote for this year to the bylaws up-to-date with CWEMF operations. The main focus of the revisions deals with specifics regarding voting during the SC meetings. Convener also stated that additional updates and modifications to the bylaws may occur in the future. Future changes to the bylaws are likely to be focused in two areas. First, further revisiting how the SC votes and any corresponding changes to the general membership voting for consistency if necessary. Second, are possible changes to CWEMF's mission statement and purpose, which may spur from the updates to the Strategic Plan. Convener encourages those members that want to find out more to participate in the SC meetings and/or the bylaws subcommittee. By-laws passed by unanimous vote.

## 7. **OLD BUSINESS (B. Bray)** – No report.

8. **NEW BUSINESS (B. Bray)** – Convener makes an announcement. The next IAGLR meeting will be in Canada. Then the following year (2015) will be in Vermont. IAGLR would like to work with CWEMF on a proposal to send one (or more?) of our members to attend, present, and exchange ideas for this 2015 meeting. If any members are interested in more information, the Convener encourages you to get involved with the steering committee or reach out to one of the CWEMF officers.

Member Hubert Morel-Seytoux inquired whether CWEMF would support his efforts to author a book that would build on his efforts participating in the past year's peer review. There was some discussion of this proposal, but no action taken.

9. **ADJOURN** (**B. Bray**) - Requested that attendees please complete the survey when it appears in your Inbox; feedback on this year's meeting help us improve next year. Convener asked those in attendance to remain for the awards program to immediately follow the meeting. Finally, Convener encouraged members to get involved in CWEMF! Convener asks members to help organize model training workshops, share their ideas and to come to Steering Committee

meetings. Convener closed the meeting thanking all in attendance for their participation at <u>6:15pm.</u>
