Dave was trained as a fisheries scientist, with a Master of Science degree in Natural Resources (Fisheries) received from the University of Michigan in 1979 and a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology in 1974. He has previously worked for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service for 14 years and the National Marine Fisheries Service for one year. During his tenure with the federal government, he received Fisheries Management Biologist of the Year Award for six western states.

From 1981 – 1990, he directed a USFWS program researching salmon in California's Central Valley and developed fishery resource restoration measures. He has performed numerous research projects on salmon for the USFWS in many rivers and streams in the Pacific Northwest. He has worked for the U.S. Department of Justice, the U.S. Department of Interior, the California Attorney General's Office and other entities as an expert witness on fishery resource issues. In 2002, Vogel provided testimony to the U.S. Congress House Resources Committee concerning the use of peer review for scientific decisions under the Endangered Species Act.

Dave has been a consulting fisheries scientist in recent years, primarily working on fishery resource issues in the western United States.
